#### **Uniform Reminder**

I'm pleased to say that on the whole, uniform is being worn correctly and families are proactive in working with us when there is a problem – broken shoes for example. In the same way, I'd like to remind parents that the following requirements are expected:

- Socks must be plain black and long enough to cover the ankle.
- Tights must be in a good state of repair.
- Leggings or jeggings are not acceptable.
- Mobile phones and headphones/ear buds must be kept in students' bags. Although a student may be directed to put them away, staff are able to confiscate these items if seen, without the need to give a warning, placing them in the Pastoral Hub for collection at the end of the day.

On World Book Day, **Thursday 7<sup>th</sup> March**, we will be launching a **Read for Good Readathon** and we'd love your child to join in. The readathon will run for just over 2 weeks, finishing on **Friday 22<sup>nd</sup> March**.

As a reward, any students taking part with be entered into a raffle to **win** one of two **£5 national book tokens**.

It's been proven that children who read for pleasure are more likely to be successful and happy throughout their lives (OECD), to promote reading, across the 2 weeks students joining in the Readathon will be given opportunities to partake in additional reading sessions and there is a super comfy bean bag and sofa area in the library that can be utilised at break and lunch.

The charity **Read for Good** encourages children to read through its unique motivational approach inspiring reluctant readers to give reading a go, and keen readers to read more widely. Pupils can choose whatever they want to read - from comics to classics and audio books to blogs - they are not being assessed, it's all about reading for fun. And, they are motivated to read because the money they raise in sponsorship helps to provide a regular supply of brand new books and a resident storyteller to every major children's hospital in the UK.

All you have to do is:

- 1. **Take a look at what they plan to read,** or help them complete their list of books to read. Remember they can read whatever they want: books, e-books, poetry, comics – anything goes! Sharing books is fine too (in fact recommended!) as well as listening to audio books.
- 2. Help your child find sponsors among family and friends. The easiest way to sponsor a child is at <a href="https://readathon.secure.force.com/sponsor">https://readathon.secure.force.com/sponsor</a> (which family and friends can use too) or return the sponsor card with a cheque(s) or cash sent to school.

Please support your child's sponsored read as much as you can.

They'll be helping kids in hospitals get books, as well as helping themselves. ...And our school receives free books worth 20% of our grand sponsorship total – so there really is something in it for everyone!
