Late Bus Provision

The Local Authority have sourced a late bus that will depart from Wadham each week-day at 4.30pm. This is a free service to students that need it, and will travel directly to the centre of Ilminster. This is the only stop on the route, but does now enable students living in Ilminster to stay and engage in after school activities, knowing that there is transport home.

Update – we've been monitoring take up of this free service and currently numbers are lower than anticipated. In order to ensure value for money, a smaller bus may be supplied to better meet demand if numbers remain low.

Year 7 – Behaviour for Learning

It's really important that we end the term well – for Year 7 this means another focus on the basics of classroom behaviour and good manners to help everyone settle and achieve.

Although I do recognise that the level of challenge schools have faced recently has made it difficult for some students to settle, we do have clear routines and expectations to create a calm and purposeful classroom atmosphere.

In this final week of term, we've made a temporary change in our policy for year 7 only, in that if they are removed from a lesson, or lose their social time due to poor behaviour, then they will go to ISR for 2 full lessons and break or lunch, whichever falls within this period.

Last term, 44 students needed this additional support to end the term well. So far, only 3 have needed it – encouraging signs that Year 7 will have the skills and discipline required for successful GCSE study, when they get there.

Year 11 Intervention – Regents Camps Workshops

2 groups of 18 students in Year 11 have risen to the challenge of 3-day, intensive support in English and Maths.

Student engagement has been superb, with many seeing a real shift in understanding and confidence in preparation for the GCSE exams – well done!

Equally, one of the course tutors asked to speak with me last week to say how impressed she was with the attitude and level of questioning shown. With a final term of preparation to go, early signs are looking good for these students!

Year 11 – Uniform After Easter?

Finally, to confirm uniform expectations for Year 11, all students will continue to wear their school uniform up to and throughout the summer exam period. This is in keeping with the expectations and discipline students have established as they continue to prepare for their final exams, and which has to remain the absolute focus of their continued work.

A "Dress your Best" day has been planned for the 21st June as part of a range of activities to celebrate the end of formal education, with further details published nearer the time.
