Re: Headteacher's Update 23rd May 2023

We are very nearly there! My update this week has to focus on how well Year 11 students have taken to their GCSE exams, as well as the positive community response to the changes in how we are managing behaviour.

Firstly, Year 11 – I have shared previously how impressed I have been with their positive attitude towards their studies, both during the day and in after-school intervention sessions. With several 'big' exams successfully navigated, it's hugely encouraging to see the number of students coming prepared to the exam briefings with notes and flashcards.

Feedback so far is that exams are going well – I always look forward to speaking with students after an exam and my favourite group currently sits on the green space behind the Hub (you know who you are!) Their honesty, commitment and care for each other as they go through this process is second to none, simply wonderful human beings!

We are continuing with the same blend of lessons, revisions lessons and exams after half-term, although students will gradually switch to more off-site study as exams progress. Mr Jackson will give further details in an update letter before the end of term.

Secondly, Behaviour – talking with students and staff over the course of the last 7 school days, one word comes to mind, 'transformational.'

The changes we have made were immediately visible – students moving with purpose to lessons, the site being empty during lesson time, and a greater acceptance of students to engage in the process of sanction and support if a mistake has been made. Mistakes are a part of learning!

The time saved by staff not having to chase students or 'negotiate' with those that persistently refuse to follow instructions has been significant, and is time that has immediately been given back in the support of others. Just as it should be.

Although I know a small number of students and parents are not happy with these changes, the overwhelming majority are – the site is calmer, the start of lessons smoother, the learning in lessons greater, as a result of firm and clear boundaries that will be consistently maintained.

As ever, I remain grateful of the support of our parents and carers as we continue to keep learning and well-being at the heart of what we do.

Wishing everyone in our Wadham Community a positive and peaceful half-term break, when it gets here.
