Dear Year 7 Parents and Carers,

## Re: Year 7 Modern Foreign Languages Choice

I am writing to inform you of a decision that Year 7 students will shortly be asked to make about their language studies from September 2024.

Modern foreign languages form an important part of our curriculum at Wadham School. As international work and travel become increasingly common, the ability to communicate in a foreign language is a critical and necessary skill. Year 7 students have therefore been learning both French and German during this academic year, to enable them to experience two different European languages and to learn about the cultures of the countries where these languages are spoken.

Now that students have had the opportunity to experience learning both languages at a basic level, we will soon be asking students to choose which language they would prefer to continue learning in Year 8 and Year 9. This will allow them to spend more curriculum time developing their skills in this language, so that they can become effective, global communicators. Additionally, we believe that focussing on one language will better prepare our students for further study of this language at GCSE level, should they opt to continue learning a language in Years 10 and 11.

Students will be asked to choose one of the following options by their language's teacher in one of their language lessons during the week commencing 29 ${ }^{\text {th }}$ April 2024:

Option 1: I would prefer to study French in Year 8 and Year 9.
Option 2: I would prefer to study German in Year 8 and Year 9.
Option 3: I do not mind whether I study French or German in Year 8 and Year 9.
I am sure you will want to discuss this with your young person so that you are aware, and if support of, the choice they will be making.

For those students who may be interested in opting for both French and German at GCSE, or for those students who simply want to keep learning both languages, there will be a variety of extracurricular opportunities for them to take part in, alongside our existing KS3 MFL lunchtime club.

When students are making their decision, we would strongly encourage them to consider their enjoyment of the language, alongside class work and previous assessment results, in order to maximize their engagement with their learning over the next two years.
