


New Staff Welcome!

NEU Industrial Action 2 days - 27.04.23 and 02.05.23

As you will be aware, a further two days of industrial action by the NEU will take place this Thursday 27th April and next Tuesday 2nd May.

The Partial Closure letter sent last week explained how we will operate on these days, a copy of which can be found on our website here:

We will be following the same arrangements as in March - with Year 11 and Sixth Form students following their normal timetables onsite, and all other students engaging with remote learning from home, using TEAMS, with their teachers if they are attending on these days.

No online lessons will take place if a member of staff is absent. Students unable to work remotely have been able to collect a pack of work from the Pastoral Hub since Monday.

As ever, vulnerable students and children of critical workers are able to attend, so long as parents have completed the online form to confirm that they are being sent in.

A reminder that industrial action is happening because of a national dispute between the unions and the government over teachers' pay and conditions of employment, and not because of any issues specifically relating to our school, although I am sorry for the ongoing disruption caused.
