I have been impressed with the 'Ready, Respectful and Safe' way in which students have returned to their studies – very much indicating that our collective efforts last term to embed this change in our culture is having the desired effect on attitude and behaviour. Staffing Update

I am delighted to announce that following successful interview we have appointed Miss Kirstie Bailey as a Geography Teacher at Wadham School. Miss Bailey is not a stranger to us – she has been working as our Academic Mentor and has now put herself forward to begin her teaching career here. At the same time, we have been fortunate to secure long-term supply cover from Mrs White, a Geography specialist.

Following changes to our timetable this week, Year 11 classes in Geography and English affected by staff absence last term now have subject specialists in place.

Battlefields Trip

Our first international school trip of the year has been successfully completed! The journey to Commonwealth war graves in France and Belgium is always a very personal and humbling experience, and one that makes lasting memories. This year was no different and I am incredibly proud of the attitude and conduct of the students involved. Cognitive Ability Tests (CATs)

Well done to all our students that completed the Cognitive Ability Tests (CAT's) recently. We are arranging sessions over the next couple of weeks for anyone that still needs to complete them. The results are being used to inform school initiatives and to focus additional support to those that need it. The data is also used as part of the moderation and review we undertake when assessing student grades, which are shared with parents when reports are published.

We will be taking a group of students from Years 9, 10 and 11 to the Somerset Careers Fair on Tuesday 8th November.

Picking Up / Dropping Off at School

A polite reminder - This is never an easy issue to resolve, but please can I ask all road users to be mindful of their surroundings when waiting to drop off/collect children from school. In particular, please ensure that you only park in permitted areas, not blocking residents' drives or junction entrances.

Student Safety – Walking and Cycling To and From School

With evenings becoming darker much earlier and the return of more unsettled, wintry weather, we are urging students to take extra care when making their way to and from school each day.

We would expect ALL cyclists to ensure they are wearing appropriate safety equipment when riding, that their bikes are roadworthy and that they have lights to be used when it is dark.

For students walking to and from school, they should be aware of their surroundings and stick to footpaths to avoid the risk of trips and falls on uneven or slippery ground.

At this time of year, we know that families sometimes make alternative arrangements for lifts and collections when the weather is particularly bad, and are asking that as part of this process children are reminded of the need to be vigilant with regard to strangers or people they do not know.
