RE: Headteacher's Update Letter 21.11.23

Thank you for a positive turn-out last week at our 'Meet the Tutor Evening' and Careers Fair.

I hope you found the evening useful, in particular the change in format and range of information we gave out on the night. This was very much the result of your feedback.

We have listened to parents (through our parent voice surveys), identified the top 3 issues you felt we needed to address and have taken action to do so.

In recent surveys you have asked us to consider and improve:

- Communication setting out a clear expectation to all stakeholders.
- How we can make parents/carers aware of what topics their children are learning, so that they can be supported in the home.
- How homework can be structured to improve core knowledge and knowledge retention.

Our response has been to:

- Develop and publish a communication booklet for all parents/carers. A copy was given out at last Thursday's evening and emailed home to all parents.
- Publish 'Learning Journeys' for every Year group a road map setting out the content, knowledge and skills to be developed in the year.
- Publish termly 'Curriculum Content Letters' to parents/carers, setting out in detail the core knowledge, by subject, that their child will be covering in that term.
- This information can be found on the Curriculum page of our website here: Wadham School - Curriculum Letters
- Publish termly 'Knowledge Organisers' for students to use in the classroom and as part of their independent learning / homework. The knowledge organiser is the go-to document for parents in helping students identify core knowledge that is being covered. Regular testing, both in lessons and at home, is vital in helping students prepare thoroughly for end of year exams.

I have always said we can only achieve the great things we do with your support, and I hope the above is a clear example of where your honest feedback has helped us make further improvements that will help everyone keep learning and well-being at the heart of what we do.

Maintaining Positive Attendance

With the cold weather finally here, it's an appropriate time to remind everyone of our expectations regarding student absence – in particular the need for parents to report their child's absence to the school.

Wadham School has a target of 96% attendance, this translates to no more than 8 days or 16 sessions per year absent within the Academic Year.

We believe in working with parents to increase student's resilience, therefore if your child is feeling unwell please medicate and send in with minor ailments rather than allowing a full day off, as children can bounce back quickly from illnesses. If your child has improved during the course of the morning please do send in at any time so they can get their afternoon session mark, late marks in this instance will be authorised as we would much rather they were attending school for part of the day than having a full day (2 sessions) absent.

Reporting Student Absence

If you decide your son/daughter is too ill to attend school please contact our Attendance Officer on **01460 270139 or via the 'Report Attendance' section in Edulink.**

Absence needs to be reported by **8:30 am** for each day of absence and an explanation needs to be given. Any absence not reported will be investigated and calls made to parents/ guardians. This is a safeguarding requirement that needs your response – thank you for your support in this regard.

We know that sometimes there may be issues preventing attendance, please communicate with us so that together we are able to identify solutions and support where it may be needed.
