

Post-16

For those who wish to seek alternative routes post-18, opportunities to explore higher apprenticeships (including at degree level) are available through close collaboration with local employers.


Head Student Team


The students on the team are chosen through a process of giving a speech, votes by staff and students and a final interview.

They will be getting involved in running house events along with charity fundraising ,Student Voice activities and taking a leading role in Sixth Form events.










Support







Challenge
