Intent: Students are offered a rich SOW that emphasises the importance of power and influence of those that have it. The aim of the various units is to build upon some of the key skills that students gained in Yr7, this will help their successfully study history at KS3 and KS4. This also encompasses the need for positive relationships and how this is partly born out of respect.
