Design & Technology	As set by the exam board, students must respond to a brief and submit a portfolio of evidence along with a prototype of their resolution. At this stage pupils will be identifying and investigating design possibilities, which will inform the design brief and specification they will individually produce. Pupils will then begin generating and developing their design ideas. In addition to this portfolio of work, pupils will have one theory lesson per fortnight in preparation for the written exam.
Engineering	As set by the exam board, students must respond to a brief and submit a portfolio of evidence along with a prototype of their resolution. They will begin by investigating the brief, before generating and developing their design ideas. In addition to this portfolio of work, pupils will have one theory lesson per fortnight in preparation for the written exam.
English	An Inspector Calls. Analyse and explore a dramatic text in detail, analysing use of language, structure, form and understanding the influence of contextual issues on a writer's viewpoint and perspective. Social and historical research Birling's speeches.
Food	Processing and production. Food production. Primary processing of food. Secondary processing of food. Turning wheat into flour – pasta and bread. Turning milk into cheese and yoghurt.
