#### RE: Headteacher's Update Letter 24.09.24

We have now completed a full cycle of the timetable. I am proud of the way in which students have settled into positive routines for learning and it has been a pleasure to visit lessons and see the work students are producing.

Our focus on Core Knowledge is helping students to 'chunk' key skills and information into manageable pieces. Retrieval starter tasks and informal assessment in the lesson demonstrate this, and next steps are for us to review and develop our framework for homework and independent study.

I'm therefore excited to announce the introduction of a Sparx Reader platform across the school as part of this growing framework. Similar to Sparx Maths, the software is set according to individual students' learning levels and increases in challenge as a student's knowledge and skill improve. We're confident that this platform will help improve literacy levels, reading ages and more importantly, help establish a regular routine of reading across our student community. Further information will be published shortly, and as ever we're grateful of the support parents and carers give to encourage their child to read at home.

I am also pleased to share that extra-curricular clubs, trips and visits have begun in earnest! Some highlights in the calendar so far are:



#### Picking Up / Dropping Off at School

A polite reminder - This is never an easy issue to resolve, but please can I ask all road users to be mindful of their surroundings when waiting to drop off/collect children from school. In particular, please ensure that you only park in permitted areas, not blocking residents' drives or junction entrances.

Please do not come onto the school site if you intend to drop-off or pick-up your child by car. Buses need to be able to enter and leave safely and too many vehicle movements, if parents are coming in or have parked in the coach area, will compromise this.

Finally, if you have any questions about where official crossings are placed, whether pedestrian refuges, zebra or pelican crossings, this should be directed to the Somerset County Council Highways team, who are the competent authority for these matters. We will ask this team to monitor the traffic movements, at the start and end of the day, so they can see if they need to take any further action.

### Student Safety - Walking and Cycling to and From School

With evenings becoming darker much earlier and the return of more unsettled, wintry weather, we are urging students to take extra care when making their way to and from school each day. We would expect ALL cyclists to ensure they are wearing appropriate safety equipment when riding, that their bikes are roadworthy and that they have lights to be used when it is dark.

For students walking to and from school, they should be aware of their surroundings and stick to footpaths to avoid the risk of trips and falls on uneven or slippery ground.

At this time of year, we know that families sometimes make alternative arrangements for lifts and collections when the weather is particularly bad, and are asking that as part of this process children are reminded of the need to be vigilant with regard to strangers or people they do not know.
