RE: Headteacher's Update Letter 10.10.24

The recent changeable weather has made break and lunchtimes more entertaining, with students and duty staff dashing on and off the field in response to the many downpours we have experienced. Wind and rain often conspire to unsettle learning — a natural phenomenon that has to be considered and catered for when teaching. I'm pleased to say that despite the recent run of poor weather, life has continued here calmly and with minimal disruption.

Students continue to show great maturity and care for their learning, which is to be commended. Every day I find examples of where their spirit and determination to do what is right over what is easy is freely applied, to the benefit of themselves and others.

A perfect example is our field. We ask that students take responsibility for keeping it clear of litter, and generally this expectation is followed. When we have concerns, students are quick to correct mistakes to ensure the field remains open.

"Opportunities not Obstacles" – a mantra I believe really does help you keep an open mind and positive outlook on the world. There will always be challenges ahead of us, but it is how we set ourselves to meet these challenges, and the actions we take, that determine how successful we will be.

"It's just relentless" one student told me last week, when I asked him how he felt the term was going, but he had a real sparkle in his eye and cheeky smile as he said it. Like many I speak to, I am humbled by the way our students embrace challenge and truly see only opportunity.

May Your will be clear and my future bright.





Positive Social Norms - Lunchtime Behaviour

It's great to see students out on the field thoroughly enjoying themselves either in football matches or playing catch. Every year group has a dedicated space for play, and generally these boundaries are respected.

This has led to a positive feeling at social time – a familiar routine, a known expectation. Unwanted behaviour has been minimal, and often only when emotions on the pitch have boiled over!

When footballs are left at home, however, play can become dysregulated. Recently we are seeing pockets of unwanted behaviour where students (typically boys) are playfighting, wrestling and piling onto a friend, who is lying on the floor.

In order to safeguard against upset, injury and damaged clothing, we have asked students not to engage in this type of 'play.' Going forward, students will be asked to leave the field for the remainder of the session if this continues.

Wadham School Late Bus

We continue to benefit from a late bus service that leaves Wadham at 4.30pm each day, making a stop in Merriott before dropping students off in the centre of Ilminster.

Like all school transport, the Late Bus is provided by Somerset County Council, and all students travelling on this bus must follow the same rules and expectations as they would using their normal school bus each day.

This means that seat belts must be worn and all passengers must remain seated throughout their journey. The driver (and also other passengers) should not be distracted by loud or inappropriate behaviour and everyone has the right to feel safe and respected by the way they are treated – this is universal and isn't something that stops at the school gate.

I would ask parents of students that use school transport to give a reminder of this expectation, to address recent concerns we have received regarding behaviour on a couple of buses, and the late bus in particular.

We also publish an initial 'settling in' report ahead of this evening to aid discussion, with teachers commenting on attributes for positive learning.


The Evening will take place from 4.00-7.00pm on Thursday 24th October.


